## **Hamburg Sustainable Development Summit (HSDS) 2017** **“Sustainability at Higher Education Institutions”**

26th-29th September 2017

Universität Hamburg, Main Building, West Wing, Edmund-Siemers-Allee 1

The first “Hamburg Sustainable Development Summit” (HSDS) will take place at the Universität Hamburg from the 26th to the 29th September 2017. The program features

workshops, interactive sessions and innovative, engaging methods focusing on the topic of “Sustainability at Higher Education Institutions”. University president Prof. Dr. Dieter Lenzen (President Universität Hamburg) and Katharina Fegebank (Second Mayor of Hamburg and Senator for Science, Research and Equal Rights) as well as representatives of the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) will open the international sustainability conference.



The HSdS is hosted by the Center for a Sustainable University (KNU) at the Universität Hamburg. The event brings together national and international academic sustainability networks and offers unique networking opportunities through the combination of the following events:

- COPERNICUS Alliance European Network on Higher Education for Sustainable Development Conference 2017
- 7<sup>th</sup> European Postgraduate Sustainable Development Symposium (SDS)
- HOCH<sup>N</sup> Sustainability at Higher Education Institutions Network Day, granted by BMBF

### **What is it all about?**

From 26th -28th September aspects of sustainable development at higher education institutions will be under consideration. Topics include: Governance, Reporting, Education for Sustainable Development, Campus and Urban Planning and Student Engagement. This interdisciplinary congress is addressed to all actors committed to fostering the transformation process towards sustainability in line with the Sustainable Development Goals. ## CA Micro Funds supports CASE event



The University of Zurich has added two new sustainability publications to their collection. *Recommendations for Action with Regard to Sustainable Investments* (available in German) and *Guideline: Sustainable Catering* (available in English and German).

*The Recommendations for Action with Regard to Sustainable Investments* is a University Executive Board adopted recommendation, addressed towards persons who represent the UZH in foundation boards or administrative boards, aims to provide members with a guideline for considering sustainability aspects in money investments.

*The Guideline: Sustainable Catering* publication presents criteria for sustainable catering and tips to prevent food waste. Written in collaboration with the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology Zurich (ETH), the publication outlines the impact of different dietary habits on the climate and provides in-depth criteria for choosing sustainable catering services.
